Differential Tuition

In December 2005, the Board of Regents, State of Iowa approved a proposal for the College of Engineering at Iowa State University to implement differential tuition for engineering junior and senior students with 60 or more credits, beginning in summer 2006. Differential tuition, sometimes referred to as supplemental tuition or a tuition surcharge, means that a college charges a [rate of tuition](#) above that which the university charges. Revenue from differential tuition supports academic excellence in Iowa State's undergraduate engineering programs and an academic environment for student success.

Assessment of Differential

Students pay differential tuition only if they have 60 or more credits and have been an engineering major for a specific number of semesters.

Students entering Iowa State as freshmen will pay differential tuition after 6 semesters (including summer), even if they have more than 60 credits on their record; (for example, due to college credit earned in high school). The term counts regardless of whether the student is enrolled. Thus, a new freshman student is exempt from differential tuition for the first six semesters.

Students transferring into engineering at Iowa State will not pay differential tuition their entry term, even if they have more than 60 credits. Summer is not counted as a semester waived, so summer students entering in the summer will have summer and fall differential tuition waved. Thus, a new transfer student is exempt from differential tuition for the first semester.

In either case, a student with fewer than 60 credits will not pay differential tuition

Appeals Process

If a student does not feel they have been appropriately charged Differential Tuition, students do have the opportunity to appeal the tuition charge. Please note: **All tuition appeals forms must be submitted by 5:00pm, 10th day of classes** to receive consideration.

A committee will review each individual appeal submission, and render a recommendation regarding assessment. The student will be notified to the university email account of the decision within two weeks of the submission deadline.
