Table 1: Student Placement on Academic Warning or Academic Probation.

Semester G.P.A. is 0.00 – 0.99	Academic Probation for next semester
75 + credits attempted or earned and cumulative G.P.A. is less than 2.00 or transfer deficiencies greater than 0	Academic Probation for next semester
On Warning status and earn less than 2.00 semester G.P.A.	Academic Probation for next semester

Table 2: Student Actions, Academic Interventions, and Outcome Options

Warning	Complete academic improvement plan and meet with academic adviser during the first 10 days of classes in the next semester. After consulting adviser, utilize university services to improve studying, examine alternative majors, etc. - OR - No meeting with adviser – registration for next semester on hold until meeting occurs.	Earn semester G.P.A. of 2.00 or higher– off academic probation - OR - Earn semester G.P.A. of less than 2.00 – academic dismissal

Please Note:

Review the "GRADE REPORT" on AccessPlus. Attempted (ISU Hours) refers to credit hours both passed & failed at ISU. Earned (total college credit earned) includes transfer credits and credit hours passed at ISU. A.P. and academic dismissal decisions are based on whichever is greater; attempted credit hours or earned credit hours.

D. Withdrawal

1. Students on Academic Probation **due to reinstatement** who request withdrawal at any time during the semester will be allowed to withdraw, however, they will be academically dismissed.
2. Students on Academic Probation who request withdrawal after the last day to drop or withdraw will be allowed to withdraw, however, they will be academically dismissed.
3. Students on Academic Probation who withdraw prior to the last day to drop or withdraw will be continued on academic probation the next term of their enrollment.

E. Summer Option

1. Students on Academic Probation who are considered for academic dismissal at the end of spring semester will be allowed to continue enrollment during the summer term. The academic dismissal decision will be reviewed at the end of the summer term (students as described above in D1 and D2 "Withdrawal" may not participate in the Summer Option).
2. Students pending dismissal from the Spring semester, who chose the Summer Option, will have their academic status reviewed at the end of summer. The combined spring/summer GPA will be used to determine whether the student should be permitted to continue enrollment after summer (please review the summer academic standards regulations in the university catalog at <http://catalog.iastate.edu/academiclife/progressprobation/#summeracademicstandardstext> for additional details).
3. Students who are removed from Academic Probation at the end of spring semester may enroll for the summer term but the combined term, summer and spring semester, GPA will be used to determine academic warning/probation status decisions at the end of summer.

E. Graduation

Students on Academic Probation for semester grade point average who are academic dismissals will be allowed to graduate if they have met all graduation requirements and have a 2.00 cumulative grade point average.
